Safety Alert –Driving Safety –First Move Forward

Did you know that the average driver operates a vehicle in reverse for only about one mile annually, yet statistics show that 25-30% of all accidents occur while vehicles are backing up?

The best way to prevent a backing accident is, Don't Back Up.

When you choose a parking space, choose one that you can pull through and park facing out so that when you exit your First Move is Forward.

If you are unable to park by pulling through, back in so that upon exiting your First Move is Forward

Before leaving a site, backing or pulling through, ALWAYS walk around your vehicle and check your blind spots.
